Attainment, Coinfidence and Resilience

Reducing the attainment gap.

Team Up works to reduce the widening attainment gap in education by helping underachieving disadvantaged pupils double their expected progress, build confidence, and improve their future prospects.

The problem we're tackling

In the UK today, the best predictor of a child's academic and social success is still the income and postcode of their parents.

- Disadvantaged pupils are nearly 2 years behind their more advantaged peers when they take their GCSEs. Covid-19 and the cost-of-living crisis have only widened this alarming gap.
- Children from low-income backgrounds are also more likely to experience low confidence and resilience, and find it difficult to engage in learning. They're 3 times more likely to be severely absent from school than others.
- 1 in 8 young people from disadvantaged backgrounds are not in education, employment or training, compared with only 1 in 25 of their peers. This gap is also widening.

By offering rigorous and inspirational tuition in maths and English, interwoven with activities and exercises to boost confidence and resilience, we help young people from low-income backgrounds, identified at risk of leaving school without qualifications, to realise their full potential.



Education is absolutely key to social mobility and a fairer society. Our tuition boosts grades, bolsters confidence, resilience and self-worth, builds future learning skills, leads to better attendance and behaviour, improves our pupils' chances of entering further education or employment – and leads to brighter futures.





What we do

Team Up have an excellent 12 year record of transforming young lives through inspirational tuition



Over a term, our volunteer tutors work with the same group of 2-3 pupils for 60-90 minutes a week. They deliver high-quality tuition in maths and English, interwoven with resilience and confidence building activities and the option of standalone enrichment sessions.

The students we work with are from low-income backgrounds, and are at risk of leaving school without reaching their full potential. Many

are low in confidence and find it difficult to engage. Our tutoring increases their academic results, more than doubling their progress on average. It bolsters their self-worth, confidence and resilience. It builds their future learning skills. And it helps improve attendance, engagement and participation.

Carefully-chosen volunteers

Our carefully-chosen volunteer tutors come from a variety of backgrounds, but more than threequarters are sixth-form or university students, often from the same schools or similar backgrounds to the pupils they work with. Trusted by pupils, they provide a new dynamic to learning and in building confidence and resilience. The experience, training and mentoring tutors gain while volunteering with Team Up has huge benefits for their future too.

Our team of programme managers – who are all ex-teachers – support and train our volunteers, and develop our outstanding curricula.

The Team Up difference

We recruit, train and support incredible volunteers to tutor 9- to 16-year-olds from low-income backgrounds in London and the South. Our pupils more than double their expected progress in maths or English on average over our 12-week programme.

Our team of programme managers – who are all ex-teachers – support and train our volunteers, and develop our outstanding curricula.

Building confidence and resilience

We have redesigned some of our resources and programme structure to incorporate activities which develop a Growth Mindset.

The students we work with are from low-income backgrounds, and are at risk of leaving school without reaching their full potential.


Partnering with schools, universities, and charities

Team Up Growth 2024-25



NUMBER OF PUPILS

With double the number of schools opting for more than one programme, we reached an additional 100 young people. Nearly 1,000 in the year and over 12,000 since our charity began.

NUMBER OF PROGRAMMES

In addition to running 2 additional tuition programmes this year, we also doubled the number of enrichment sessions delivered with partners. 41 programmes in three terms.


NUMBER OF HOURS

Increased numbers of programmes and pupils reached saw an impressive 18% increase to the number of hours delivered in 24-25. **Over 7,000 hours of tuition**

NUMBER OF PARTNERS

We grew our academic partners this year by 20% and will repeat this rate of growth again in 2025-26.

Pupil Impact



We increase GCSE pass rates from 48% to 67%

48% of our secondary pupils are on track to receive a GCSE pass in English or maths when we start working with them. By the end of the 12-week Team Up programme, that rises to 67%.



We more than double expected progress

On average, our secondary pupils start working with us between 3 and 17 months behind in their learning. By the end of the 12-week Team Up programme, our pupils progress by around 8 months.


Our impact

Our impressive results show our tutoring works. It raises academic results, improves confidence and resilience, and helps inspire pupils for the future.

Over 12-15 weeks, our incredible tutors on average more than double their students' rate of academic progress, increase pupil confidence and resilience, and set them on the path to a positive future.

Expected progress vs Team Up progress (2024-2025)

Across the whole 2024 - 2025 cohort our pupils made on average **over .7 grade of progress compared with an expected rate of progress without tuition of 0.3.** This equates to 8 months of progress in just one term.






Building confidence and resilience

In addition to our excellent work in raising attainment, we are now increasing our focus on building resilience and confidence in our pupils. Helping our pupils have more of a growth mindset will serve as a platform for their future learning and serve hard-pressed schools by increasing engagement, attendance and participation in class.

You can see from the graphs on the right that there is a significant positive shift in responses to each statement, and numbers of "disagree' and 'neutral' significantly decrease. On average our pupils benefit from a 25% increase in confidence.

The benefits for our tutors

Our tutors come from all sorts of backgrounds. However, more than 70% are sixth-form or university students, often from the same schools or similar backgrounds to the young people they tutor. 58% of applicants are from ethnic minority communities.



Boost their CV

A chance to gain real life experience to improve leadership, teamwork, communication and organisational skills.

Make connections - mentoring

All Team Up tutors 25 or under can benefit from a place on our 12-month mentoring programme. They'll meet their mentor every 12 weeks or so.

Become a trained tutor

Tutoring is a skill and can be used to make extra money through University or as great preparation for teaching. "I felt I was making a tangible difference whilst developing my own time-management and planning skills."
